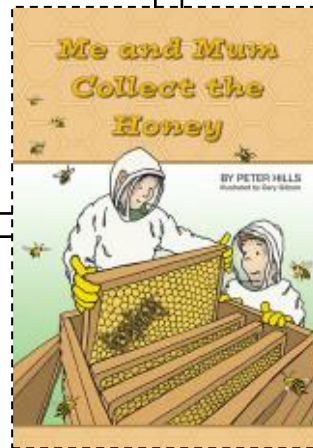
1. What did Mum light?
