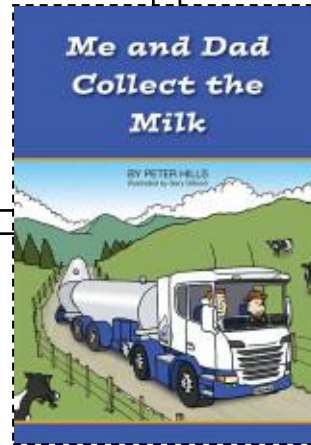
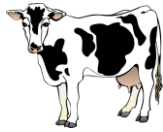
1. What were all the animals in the story? Name them.
